## Covid-19 Vaccine Update

As you may know, children as young as 16-years-old are now eligible for the Covid-19 vaccination. Public Health Madison & Dane County (PHMDC) is currently utilizing the <u>Wisconsin COVID-19 Vaccine</u> <u>Registry</u> to help schedule vaccination opportunities for those interested. On April 8th, we were informed that PHMDC is expecting more of the Pfizer vaccination starting next week, which is the vaccine that can be given to 16 and 17-year-olds. If you have an eligible student and are interested in getting them vaccinated, you can register them on the <u>Wisconsin COVID-19 Vaccine Registry</u>

## **ASPIRE** Testing

9th and 10th-grade students will be taking the **Aspire test on Tuesday, April 27th, 2021.** This test is an early high school version of the ACT. It gives students critical feedback on their academic strengths and areas in need of improvement. It also provides indicators of college readiness, as well as an estimated ACT score. Encourage your student to do their best, and please avoid making appointments on this day. Students perform better after a good night's sleep and a hearty breakfast. Contact



## FORWARD Testing

The Wisconsin Forward Exam will be administered to students who are in grade 10 at the high school level each spring. Students will be completing the portion of the Forward Exam in Social Studies. The Exam is designed to gauge how well students are doing in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards. These standards outline what students should know and be able to do in order to be college and career-ready. The Forward Exam is administered online in the spring of each school year. Students will utilize their Chromebooks to access the state test. Their performance on the assessment will not affect any of their current grades. Please encourage your son or daughter to take the test seriously and do the best they can.

The Exam includes:

• Multiple-choice questions: the student selects the correct answers from answer options;

• Short answer questions: the student provides a brief explanation in response to the question; Students must bring their charged Chromebook to their Ancient World History class in order to complete the online assessment. Accommodations and supports for students with disabilities and/or English language learners are built into the system so that the progress of students can be accurately measured. 10th-grade students will take this test in their Ancient World History classes on **May 4th** and **May 5th**. Students who are Virtual or need to complete make-up time will be invited to do so on **May 1th & May 12th** from 7:45 - 8:30 am in the Large Cafetorium. # A/P Testing Information

This year almost all of the AP exams are being offered in a digital format. The exceptions are the World Language exams and Music Theory - they are only being offered as pencil-paper exams. The CollegeBoard provided us with three testing window options. The testing window that was selected by the district was selected for two reasons: 1) to allow teachers the most time to teach their college-level curriculum and the students the most time to learn this college-level material considering the different schedules the district has been working under this year and 2) this testing window offered all of the exams we offer as digital exams.

I would like to be able to offer more information about the digital exams at this time, but I cannot as the information coming from the CollegeBoard is changing weekly (the next update is due out April 8th). Students will receive more information from their AP teachers in May.

One question that has come up that I will address here is: "I do not want to take the exam anymore how do I cancel it? Will I get my exam fee refunded?" The answer is: You cancel your exam by not taking the exam. Once the exams are completed on June 11, I will compare the list of exams ordered (paid for) to the list of exams taken and any student that paid for an exam but did not take the exam will receive a full refund. The refund will be pushed back to families through Campus Portal.

## World Language Department News

¡Hola! Guten Tag! Hello from the World Language Department! Spanish and German classes are off to a great start for the second semester! Here's a look at what we've been working on.

Level 1: Students in Spanish and German one just finished their third unit for the year, and we are about to embark on our last one: Geography. We are very excited to start this one, as we will be able to tie in everything we have learned throughout the year to learn about the different countries and cultures in more detail. We will explore similarities and differences between countries outside of the US both geographically and culturally using vocabulary from our past units of clothing and personal identity, school and free-time activities, and family and food.

**Level 2:** Students in level 2 finished investigating travel habits around the world and have now started the shopping unit. They are exploring how culture influences where and why we shop and what we buy, along with looking at some sustainability practices found in other parts of the world. They are also using authentic texts, such as supermarket websites from the target culture, to make comparisons to their own shopping habits. Now students are able to express themselves in the past tense in the target language, in addition to present and future tenses.

**Level 3**: Students in German and Spanish 3 just finished their unit on education and careers. In addition to talking about their own future plans, students researched a country outside of the United States. They looked at how various factors influence the education and career opportunities available.

in that country. Students completed a choice writing or speaking project about the information they learned. For the last quarter of the year, students in level 3 will be exploring the food culture of the target language countries.

**Level 4:** We just completed our unit on political conflicts in German and Spanish-speaking countries. Students studied various wars, dictatorships, revolutions, and protests and have completed cultural comparisons between these conflicts and conflicts in the United States. Spanish 4 students even read an entire book in Spanish! Next, students will look into common uses of personal technology around the world and investigate the positive and negative influences they have on daily life.

**German & Spanish 5/AP:** We have been working on our third AP theme of "Science & Technology" focusing specifically on technological advancements in our world. Students have learned to discuss past and present inventions throughout the world and also explored future technologies and ideas, such as improvements in data security and genetic modification. Students have spent a lot of time reflecting on their own lives and the effects that advancements in science and technology have in other countries, as well as comparing cultural ideas about science and technology with the United States. Our next unit will be the AP theme of "Beauty & Aesthetics".


While working outside of school, students have been preparing for the annual Band Variety Show which will be fully virtual this year. The show will be premiered on YouTube in May - watch for more details!


