STEPS ACADEMY

The **STEPS Academy** gives students the work readiness skills they need to successfully apply, interview, and participate in high wage, high demand careers. It primarily supports students who are not quite ready for a Youth Apprenticeship to develop a career plan, resume, interview and communication skills to be prepared to enter a Youth Apprenticeship. It also supports the skills needed to transition from high school into post-secondary and community engagement.

- Students are eligible to participate in **STEPS** if they:
 Qualify for free or reduced lunch programs or live in an identified high poverty
- census tract area
- Have one or more barriers to employment, including if you are an English language learner, disabled (have an IEP or 504 or medical or mental health diagnosis), homeless, a foster child or runaway, pregnant or parenting, an ex-offender, or basic skills deficient (score 13/14 or lower on the ACT).
- Are juniors or seniors in high school
- Eligible to work in the United States
- Registered for Selective Service (if required)

ACT ASPIRE Testing

The **ACT Aspire** will be given to students in grades 9 and 10 at Stoughton High School on **Tuesday**, **April 21, 2020**. The ACT Aspire is a standardized test designed to evaluate and report on student learning and college and career readiness. The ACT Aspire Early High School assessment measures what students have learned in the areas of English, reading, math, science, and writing. The scores from this assessment predict how a student will perform on the ACT in 11th grade.

Students in grades 11 and 12 will not attend school on this day. Students in grades 9 and 10 should arrive at their regular time but maybe finished with testing and allowed to leave school by 3 pm. Busses will run on the normal schedule.
