
# Art News

Kindergarteners and first graders are working on a variety of art including drawings, sculptures, and painted paper collages. Second and third grade students recently created self-portraits inspired by the Mexican artist Frida Kahlo. Fourth and fifth grade students are demonstrating their knowledge about radial symmetry with drawings and folded origami compositions.











### **Physical Education Updates**

### Grade K and 1:

Our kindergarten and 1st grades are about half way through our gymnastics unit. We have been focusing on basic tumbling skills, balances, and locomotor movements while stressing the importance of safety throughout our gymnastics lessons.

Students have also had the opportunity to learn how to safely use a variety of gymnastics equipment such as: balance beams, parallel bars, uneven bars, and vault. Students have also been improving their muscular strength by using our climbing rope, pull up bar, rock wall, cargo net, and swing. Lastly, classes were able to use our



tumbling mats as walls for a variety of exciting hide and seek games (see pictures), where we learned about fair game play, honesty, and strategy.


### Grades 2, 3, 4, and 5:

We are just over half way through our gymnastics unit at Fox Prairie! We have had a lot of fun learning and practicing the fundamentals of tumbling. Students have improved their flexibility with various locomotor movements, stretches, and balance challenges.

They have also improved their personal strength climbing our rope, performing pull ups, and executing basic tumbling movements. Another exciting component of this unit is our gymnastics station work where students improve their fitness levels while safely using our rock wall, uneven bars, pommel horse, rope swing, and balance beams.

Welcome to Fox Prairie Music! Thank you to everyone who attended the Winter Sing Concert! Students enjoyed showing off the skills and knowledge that they have gained so far this school year. It was a wonderful success!

In January, students practiced their listening and evaluation skills by watching and discussing the concert. They have also started learning about a very important element of music: melody. Students will learn about and experience different aspects of melody through singing, playing instruments, creating, moving, and responding to music.

Kindergarten is experiencing melody by exploring high & low pitches, solfége patterns, and melodic contour.

1st grade is experiencing melody by exploring high/low pitches, so-mi-la-do patterns, and melodic contour.

2nd grade is experiencing melody by exploring melodic contour, do-re-mi-sola solfége patterns, skips & steps, and do pentatonic.

3rd grade is experiencing melody by exploring melodic direction, more advanced solfége patterns, pentatonic scales, and pitch names.

4th grade is experiencing melody by exploring melodic contour & direction, pentatonic & major scales, sequences, and pitch names. They are also learning the Norwegian National Anthem.

grade is experiencing melody by exploring various modes/scales as well as advanced melodic & solfége patterns. Select 5th graders have also started practices for their musical in May.

### Winter Weather Recess Guidelines

Please note the following guidelines that we use for students at recess time:

- 60+ Degrees Students do not need to wear a coat to recess.
- 35-59 Degrees Students need to wear a jacket or, at least, long sleeves
- 35 Degrees and below Students need to wear a coat, gloves, hat & their legs must be covered.

If there is snow:

- Students must wear boots, coat, and snowpants to play on the equipment or in the fields.
- Students must stay on the blacktop if they do not have boots coat, and snowpants.

Students who are dressed for the temperature are more prepared with warm clothing and are able to stay dryer as they enjoy playing in our winter weather. Thank you for helping with that!

Please note that the district's practice is to have outdoor recess as long as the wind chill temperature is -5 or warmer. Hopefully we'll be able to keep everyone healthy this winter as the temperatures continue to drop.

### Watch D.O.G.S. Sign Up

### Who are Watch D.O.G.S?

Watch D.O.G.S. are fathers, mothers, grandfathers, grandmothers, guardians, aunts, uncles, or community members, etc., who volunteer for a half or full school day at an official Watch D.O.G.S. school. During the day, Watch D.O.G.S. may read and work on school activities with students, play at recess, eat lunch with students, watch school entrances and hallways, and any other assigned activities where they actively engage with students. On the day of their participation, Watch D.O.G.S. are given a brief review of their involvement and wear an official Watch D.O.G.S. t-shirt identifying them as a Watch D.O.G.S. in the building.

#### **Program Benefits**

- Students gain positive role models.
- Schools gain extra sets of eyes and ears. The presence of volunteer adults provides an
  additional deterrent to bullying, enhances a sense of security in the building, and helps
  create an environment conducive to learning.
- Adults get a glimpse of our students' everyday world and learn about the increasingly complex challenges and decisions today's youth are facing. As a result, they can learn to relate better to their student and connect with them.
