



















Forward Exam Test Results: How to request a paper copy




Sandhill WFK has once again chosen to partner with School Tool Box to order prepackaged school supplies for the 2021-22





COVID UPDATES

Masking Up Through June 9

SASD continues to require masks for students and staff through June 9 and most likely during our 4-week Summer EXCEL program, even though Public Health Madison & Dane County will lift all gathering and masking orders on June 2.



Student Quarantine & Close Contacts Reminders



We are seeing a larger number of students being sent home to quarantine. As a district, we elected to physically distance anywhere between 3-feet and 6-feet. Even though students may be 3 feet apart, the definition of a close contact remains 6 feet:

A close contact means that a student was within 6 feet of an individual with a positive COVID case for more than 15 minutes within a 24-hour period.


Therefore when students are 3 feet apart, there are likely more close contacts identified each time there is a positive COVID-19 case. This accounts for the larger numbers of students in quarantine.

We continue to follow our COVID-19 Action Plan: Quarantine time remains 14 days for anyone who is not fully vaccinated. People are considered <u>fully vaccinated</u> only if 2 weeks has passed since their second dose in a 2-dose series, or 2 weeks has passed after their single-dose vaccine. <u>If you don't meet these requirements, regardless of your age, you are NOT fully vaccinated</u>.



COVID Reminders:

As a reminder: At Sandhill, we are still using many protocols and mitigation strategies to reduce the spread of COVID-19. We continue to follow the recommendations from PHMDC. If at any point we believe that your student was a close contact to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 at our school district, we will reach out to you. **No news is good news.** Please remember that due to privacy protection laws, we are often unable to share many details about specific COVID cases at school.



There have also been some questions from parents about quarantining and the length of the quarantine. Since we are following the 14 day quarantine, a negative test does not change the length of quarantine. PHMDC still considers the 14 day quarantine as the safest option and quarantine would not be required if a person is fully vaccinated (2 weeks post vaccination) but symptom monitoring would need to continue for 14 days.

SELF-SCREEN QUICK SHEET



Before sending your student to school, you must screen them.

Answer the question: Does my student meet one or more of the self-screen criteria listed? If NO, you may send your student to school. If YES, follow the Next Steps.

- 1. Call your school's attendance line to report your student's absence.

- 3. Contact your health care provider for next steps.



*Symptoms of COVID-19



- Cough
- Shortness of breath or Sore throat difficulty breathing
- Fever equal to or greater than 100.4°F
- Chills
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Diarrhea
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
