Lunch Changes for the Week of the Winter Sing

Due to the Winter Sing on Thursday, December 19th, our kitchen staff has made the following changes for the lunch program that week:

On Monday, December 16, the menu will be: All American Burger Basket, potato wedges, Max Stix with marinara sauce or Turkey Deli Sandwich. Also: California blend vegetables, fresh fruit & vegetable bar.

On the day of the Winter Sing, Thursday, December 19th, students will be eating in their classrooms because the cafeteria will be set up for the show. Our kitchen will prepare a cold lunch for students that day. The cold lunch will consist of a turkey sandwich, apple, carrots, cookie and milk.

Details for Our Winter Sing on December 19th

Fox Prairie students are working hard on this year's "Winter Sing" which will be held on Thursday, December 19th, 2019, at 8:30AM and 1:30PM in the school gym. Guests are always welcome to attend. Chairs and bleacher seating will be available!

During November and December students have been primarily focusing on their performance skills. Students are working towards confidence in front of large audiences, singing in the group and also audience etiquette. Each student will be concentrating on stage so we ask audience members to refrain from calling out or waving as they sing. Assessment for this unit will be based on participation and knowledge of performance skills.

Students are asked to wear the following colors for the show:

Kindergarten: white shirts/outfits

First Grade: blue shirts/outfits

Second Grade: yellow or brown shirts/outfits

Third Grade: green or brown shirts/outfits

Fourth Grade: red shirts/outfits

Fifth Grade: purple shirts/outfits

What it is: On Thursday, December 19th, there will be two identical performances for grades K-5 presented. We arrange seating for nearly 400 people in the gym, where the performance takes place.

When to go? To help spread the crowd between the two presentations, one at 8:30 a.m and one at 1:30 p.m., we suggest that families attend the morning or afternoon performances based on the following: Families whose last name begins with letters A-L should attend the morning session, while those whose last names begin with letters M-Z should attend the afternoon performance. If you must schedule around work or other commitments, it is certainly alright to attend a session other than the one suggested.

Parking: Please pay attention to the "No Parking" signs on West South Street. In years past, the Stoughton Police Department ticketed many vehicles parked illegally during the performance. Also, please make sure not to block driveways of those who live in the neighborhood. Please give ample time to park in a legal location and walk to the school.

School lunch on the 19th: Finally, on the 19th, students will be eating their lunch in the

classroom because the gym will be filled with audience seating and unable to be used as the lunchroom. School lunch will be a brown bag with one lunch selection; typically a sandwich, carrot strips, fruit, cookie and milk. Please make note of this change in the meal in case you would rather send a lunch from home or if your child does not like what is in the bag lunch. We will take lunch count for school lunch that morning.

Winter Weather Recess Guidelines

Please note the following guidelines that we use for students at recess time:

- 60+ Degrees - Students do not need to wear a coat to recess.
- 35-59 Degrees - Students need to wear a jacket or, at least, long sleeves
- 35 Degrees and below - Students need to wear a coat, gloves, hat & their legs must be covered.

If there is snow:

- Students must wear boots, coat, and snowpants to play on the equipment or in the fields.
- Students must stay on the blacktop if they do not have boots, coat, and snowpants.

Students who are dressed for the temperature are more prepared with warm clothing and are able to stay dry as they enjoy playing in our winter weather. Thank you for helping with that!

Please note that the district's practice is to have outdoor recess as long as the wind chill temperature is -5 or warmer. Hopefully we'll be able to keep everyone healthy this winter as the temperatures continue to drop.

Extra Clothes at School

It's always a good idea to have an extra pair of pants & undies at school for your child. Please put an extra pair of each in your child's backpack. When we've had rain overnight, we remind students to stay on the wood chips and blacktop only, but sometimes it's hard to avoid getting a bit wet.

We're always in need of extra pants, especially for our younger students. If you have any extra pants that your child has outgrown, please send them in, and we'll put them to good use.

Watch D.O.G.S. Sign Up

Who are Watch D.O.G.S.?

Watch D.O.G.S. are fathers, mothers, grandfathers, grandmothers, guardians, aunts, uncles, or community members, etc., who volunteer for a half or full school day at an official Watch D.O.G.S. school. During the day, Watch D.O.G.S. may read and work on school activities with students, play at recess, eat lunch with students, watch school entrances and hallways, and any other assigned activities where they actively engage with students. On the day of their participation, Watch D.O.G.S. are given a brief review of their involvement and wear an official Watch D.O.G.S. t-shirt identifying them as a Watch D.O.G.S. in the building.

Program Benefits

- Students gain positive role models.
- Schools gain extra sets of eyes and ears. The presence of volunteer adults provides an additional deterrent to bullying, enhances a sense of security in the building, and helps create an environment conducive to learning.
- Adults get a glimpse of our students' everyday world and learn about the increasingly complex challenges and decisions today's youth are facing. As a result, they can learn to relate better to their student and connect with them.
