## **Covid Updates**

#### Masking Up Through June 9

SASD continues to require masks for students and staff through June 9 and most likely during our 4-week Summer EXCEL program, even though Public Health Madison & Dane County will lift all gathering and masking orders on June 2.

**Student Quarantine & Close Contacts Reminders** 

We are seeing a larger number of students being sent home to quarantine. As a district, we elected to physically distance anywhere between 3-feet and 6-feet. Even though students may be 3 feet apart, the definition of a close contact remains 6 feet:

A close contact means that a student was within 6 feet of an individual with a positive COVID case for more than 15 minutes within a 24-hour period.

Therefore when students are 3 feet apart, there are likely more close contacts identified each time there is a positive COVID-19 case. This accounts for the larger numbers of students in quarantine.

We continue to follow our COVID-19 Action Plan: Quarantine time remains 14 days for anyone who is not fully vaccinated. People are considered <u>fully vaccinated</u> only if 2 weeks have passed since their second dose in a 2-dose series, or 2 weeks have passed after their single-dose vaccine. <u>If you don't meet these requirements, regardless of your age, you are NOT fully vaccinated.</u>


## Sign Ups for Next Week's SASD & Stoughton Health Vaccination Clinic

We have partnered with Stoughton Health to offer a COVID-19 vaccination clinic on Wednesday, May 26 from 3:45 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. in the Stoughton High School Fieldhouse. Sign-ups are required <u>here</u>.

Students are our focus for this clinic so we ask that guardians first sign up their 12-18-year-olds before signing up themselves. If your child is under 18, the child's guardian must fill out the form and attend the appointment with their child. (Note: The form requires "Employer" and "Job Title" fields. If these are not applicable, please write "Student.")

## Forward Exam Test Results

All students who participated in the Spring 2021 Forward Exam will receive test results in Infinite Campus. For families who request a hard copy of your students' ISR, please use this form to request. The ISR is generated from the annual Forward Exam and gives a more detailed version of your student's assessment results. ISRs will be mailed out in batches from the Stoughton Area School District Administration Office on a regular basis beginning in August 2021 at the earliest. - 3) Virtual: would hold a welcome to SHS when we arrive back at school.



## A/P Testing Information

This year almost all of the AP exams are being offered in a digital format. The exceptions are the World Language exams and Music Theory - they are only being offered as pencil-paper exams. The CollegeBoard provided us with three testing window options. The testing window that was selected by the district was selected for two reasons: 1) to allow teachers the most time to teach their college-level curriculum and the students the most time to learn this college-level material considering the different schedules the district has been working under this year and 2) this testing window offered all of the exams we offer as digital exams.



I would like to be able to offer more information about the digital exams at this time, but I cannot as the information coming from the CollegeBoard is changing weekly (the next update is due out April 8th). Students will receive more information from their AP teachers in May.

One question that has come up that I will address here is: "I do not want to take the exam anymore how do I cancel it? Will I get my exam fee refunded?" The answer is: You cancel your exam by not taking the exam. Once the exams are completed on June 11, I will compare the list of exams ordered (paid for) to the list of exams taken and any student that paid for an exam but did not take the exam will receive a full refund. The refund will be pushed back to families through Campus Portal.
