A MESSAGE FROM DR. ONSAGER - MEAL NOW CAN BE DELIVERED!

Good afternoon SASD Families,

This communication is in regards to daily school meals available to all children aged 18 and under and students aged 19-21 who have not yet graduated, regardless of free & reduced meal status.

Currently the district offers daily meal pickup at four locations via a sign up form. In an effort to better serve our students and support the current stay at home order, we will be moving to door to door delivery effective April 17, 2020. We will also provide meals for the weekend. This service will continue until school resumes.

Families currently picking up meals will be automatically moved to the new process below effective April 17. The district will call families already on our sign up list starting the week of April 13 to confirm and review the new process.

Families not signed up but who would like to may do so by clicking here. Please note a SEPARATE FORM for each child is needed to ensure each meal is included in our daily count. You will receive a confirmation phone call after submission which will review the delivery protocol.

Door to Door Delivery Process

Deliveries will be made on Monday, Wednesday and Friday between 11 a.m. and 12 p.m. Each household will receive a call from the district with the review of protocol.

Monday delivery will include: lunch for Monday; breakfast and lunch for Tuesday; and breakfast for Wednesday.

Wednesday delivery will include: lunch for Wednesday; breakfast and lunch for Thursday; and breakfast for Friday.

Friday delivery will include: lunch for Friday; breakfast and lunch for Saturday; breakfast and lunch for Sunday; and breakfast for Monday.

OPT-OUT VIDEO CONFERENCING

Dear Parents and Guardians,

On March 13, 2020, the Governor of the State of Wisconsin ordered all public and private schools in the State of Wisconsin to close effective March 18, 2020. Per the Governor's Order, the schools shall remain closed for the duration of the public health emergency or until a subsequent order lifts the restriction. In light of the Governor's Order, our District will be communicating electronically with parents and using electronic means and virtual/online platforms to facilitate the provision of educational services.

To that end, your child's teacher may provide virtual lessons and/or discussions via video conferencing applications. Teachers will use Zoom, Schoology Conferences, or Google Meet to hold video conferences with students. Teachers will directly invite students to a password-protected video conference through a district-managed application. Students will accept the invite through their district-managed Google account. This is a direct connection and no additional log-in is required if students are already logged into their accounts. The video classroom is for school managed activities only.

It will be the responsibility of the teacher to disconnect the video session once the lesson or check-in has been completed. Students should be located in a quiet environment which is free from distractions or items which may not conform to school rules and guidelines. Students must also wear clothing that conforms to the District's dress code, and comply with all other aspects of the District's Code of Conduct. To promote confidentiality of student information, if the video lesson or video meeting includes any other student, your student should not include other children or adults in your household in the lesson or meeting.

If you do not consent for your child to participate in video conferencing, please let us know by filling out this electronic form <u>linked here</u>. Please note that there will be no penalization for opting your child out of participating in video conferencing. Your child can still participate in other assignments or activities associated with virtual learning. In Partnership,

VIRTUAL LEARNING FOR OUR STUDENTS

- Please have your child(ren) login each day to complete lessons and activities according to your family's schedule. The number of hours needed will vary by age of the students.
- Let your teacher know if you or your child needs help with anything or if your child is struggling to complete assignments.
- Don't forget to check-in using the <u>Daily Attendance Google form</u> before the end of the school day. This form is how we are tracking attendance in the learning activities. You should complete one form for each child that participates in the Sandhill learning activities. We will record the attendance the following day in Infinite Campus.
- Participate in Zoom meetings as it works for your family. We LOVE seeing their smiling faces.
- Check the <u>Daily Announcements</u> to keep informed.

Tips for Virtual Learning

- Stay Positive!
- Set a routine for each day. This does not need to be a set schedule. The kids are used to having certain things in the morning and afternoon. Work with your child to see what works best for your family.

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- Take breaks between lessons/activities.
- Designate a space for learning.

- Keep your materials in one place so things you need don't get lost.
- Remember to charge your Chromebook, laptop or tablet!
- Check in with your teacher if you need something :)


