Upcoming ALICE Drills

Next week, **on Thursday (5/20/2021)**, classroom teachers will be reviewing with our students what to do if there is an emergency. For our youngest learners, we introduce these concepts through the book <u>"I'm not scared. I'm prepared!"</u> (Shared in the <u>3/22 Newsletter</u>). The information we provide is brief and offers them reassurance that there are many adults here to protect them. For our 3-5 students, we work through the ALICE protocol in a child-friendly, informative and non-threatening way.



Safety drills help us evaluate our emergency operations plan, improve our response skills and prepare our students and staff in the event of an actual emergency. At the close of the drills, we will send out a message to families informing you that the drills are complete.

How does it work?

From now until May 18, students will collect pledges from family and friends and record them on a pledge sheet. Pledges can be made for a specific amount or as a specified amount per lap (each lap is 1/10 of a mile). On May 18, each grade level will run for 25 minutes around the big circle at Sandhill.

After the run, your child will receive a piece of paper stating how many laps they have completed. Please record this number on your child's pledge sheet. This will help your child with collecting pledges from people who pledged per lap.

Parent/Guardian Input Form for Classroom Placement

The staff at all three elementary buildings work carefully to create classroom

placements. The goal is to create heterogeneous classroom groups to accommodate the learning needs and styles of every student. Parents/guardians can also provide specific information about their child that could be helpful in assisting the student placement process. We take all input into consideration.

This <u>PARENT/GUARDIAN INPUT FORM</u> will ask you to summarize your child's strengths and special interests, and the type of learning environment in which your child can experience success. There will not be a place where you can request a specific teacher. Forms that list a specific teacher will not be considered.

The following factors are considered when assigning children to classrooms for the upcoming year:

- 1. Maintaining Similarity of Classroom Sections:
 - Balancing by gender
 - Balancing by ability levels (below, on, above grade level)
 - Balancing special needs and gifted and talented students
 - Maintaining classroom size as per district policy
- 2. Peer Relationships and Personalities:
 - Considerations are made based on whether students have significant difficulties
 - with one another or who get along too well.
- 3. Related Arts and Individual Education Planning Team Requests:
 - Input from both teams is considered.


Any parent/guardian input **must be in writing** on the attached form.


INPUT FORM FOR CLASSROOM PLACEMENT

The truth of this picture really resonates with me and is a great reminder to always lead with kindness, empathy, and listen to understand.

It also mimics the "pink dot/white space of behavior" principle in NHA. If we think of undesirable behavior as the pink dot and




However, when we energize the pink dot and ignore the white space the pink dot grows. The good news? When we relentlessly energize the white space (Stand #1: Absolutely YES!) the pink dot gets smaller.

If you look really closely at the pink dot (below), you might see the shadow behind it that a workshop participant pointed out could be trauma that is impacting the behavior which leads us back to why you should be gentle with people because you just never know.




COVID Reminders:

As a reminder: At Sandhill, we are still using many protocols and mitigation strategies to reduce the spread of COVID-19. We continue to follow the recommendations from PHMDC. If at any point we believe that your student was a close contact to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 at our school district, we will reach out to you. **No news is good news.**

Please remember that due to privacy protection laws, we are often unable to share many details about specific COVID cases at school.

There have also been some questions from parents about quarantining and the length of the quarantine. Since we are following the 14 day quarantine, a negative test does not change the length of quarantine. PHMDC still considers the 14 day quarantine as the safest option and quarantine would not be required if a person is fully vaccinated (2 weeks post vaccination) but symptom monitoring would need to continue for 14 days.



SELF-SCREEN QUICK SHEET



Before sending your student to school, you must screen them.

Answer the question: Does my student meet one or more of the self-screen criteria listed? If NO, you may send your student to school. If YES, follow the Next Steps.

- 1. Call your school's attendance line to report your student's absence.


