Wow, what a week! ASPIRE testing is almost complete and the alternate sports season is winding down. Meanwhile, Spring activities are cranking up and, May is going to be a month full of activities, learning, and fun.

As we start this last stretch, please be mindful that if a student tests positive for COVID or is considered by our District Health Professional to be a COVID close contact...the student will not be allowed on campus or be able to participate in activities/athletics during their established quarantined time. Quarantine may be up to 14 days. After their quarantine period is completed, students will only be allowed back to school or activities when they are symptomfree. This would include all school-related activities including Prom, Awards Programs, and Graduation. During quarantine, students will only attend school virtually if possible based on their health.

As the weather gets warmer and family and friends begin to gather more, please be safe and minimize your possible exposure.

Preventative Measures for Students while Off Campus

Students, 14-day quarantines are not fun, especially when you are unable to see friends and attend school in person. Please take the following measures to reduce your chances of having to quarantine:

- When going off-campus for lunch, get your food to go and find a park or green space to eat outside, more than 6 feet apart. When you are not eating, wear a mask.
- While studying with friends or classmates, Zoom is the best option. If you cannot use Zoom and must study in the same space, set up on opposite sides of the room or table.
- When riding in the same vehicle with others, not in the same household, wear your masks. You can also roll the windows down for increased ventilation. There is a high probability of

transmission if you take your mask off while eating in a space where you are not 6 feet apart from others.

 As the weather warms up, commit to finding outdoor activities to hang out with your friends, such as hiking, picnics, or going on walks or bike rides, with masks on. Choosing outdoor activities rather than indoor activities, including eating in close quarters, is a safer and smarter option.

MAKE UP ASPIRE TESTING

9th and 10th-grade students took the Aspire test on Tuesday, April 27th, 2021. This test is an early high school version of the ACT. The results give students critical feedback on their academic strengths and areas in need of improvement. It also provides indicators of college readiness, as well as an estimated ACT score.

The make up schedule will be as follows:

Monday, May 3rd from 9 to 11:15 am

Tuesday, May 4th from 9 to 11:15 Wednesday, May 5th from 9 to 9:45 am

Please note the following as the test date approaches:

- The test is in person at Stoughton High School. There is not a virtual option.
- Students must wear masks and follow social distancing guidelines.
- Any family, virtual or in-person, may opt-out of the test.
- To opt-out, email High School Principal Mike Kruse: <u>mike.kruse@stoughton.k12.wi.us</u>.
- Please make sure your student comes to school with their Chromebook fully charged.
- The Mathematics test allows the use of a calculator. There is a calculator embedded into the test, but students may bring their own calculator. Calculators must meet the following guidelines: <u>ACT</u> <u>calculator policy</u>

FORWARD Testing

10th-grade students will be taking the FORWARD Test during the first two weeks of May. Those students who are attending school in person will take the test in their Ancient World History classes on Tuesday, May 4th & Wednesday, May 5th, 2021. We are asking Virtual students (and in-person absent students) to come in during the Virtual Learning Support Time on Tuesday, May 11th, and Wednesday, May 12th, 2021 to complete the tests. There are two tests - one will be given each day.

Please note the following as the test day approaches:

- May 4th and May 5th will be ASYNCHRONOUS Workdays for Ancient World History Virtual students on these days. NO Zoom class for Ancient World History ONLY on those days.
- Students will use Chromebooks to test. Please make sure that your student comes to school with their Chromebook fully charged. (Just like for the Aspire Test)
- Any family, virtual or in-person, may opt-out of the test.
- To opt-out, please email Mike Kruse: mike.kruse@stoughton.k12.wi.us
- Virtual students will have an opportunity to take this test on May 11th AND May 12th (2 tests 2 dates) at 8:00 am-8:45 am
- Students may enter the high school on May 11th & 12th starting at 7:45 from the back of the school, door #21.
- We ask that Virtual students please sign up to take the test on May 11th and May 12th to help ensure adequate spacing is planned out. Sign up <u>HERE</u>.
- Makeup day & time for those students who miss class on May 4th -5th will be the same as it is for the Virtual students May 11th & May 12th from 8:00 am 8:45 am

STAR Testing

Stoughton High School will be implementing the STAR Reading and STAR Math assessments from May 3 through May 14th, 2021.

Testing will take place during Language Arts and Math classes in grades 9, 10, and 11.

A/P Testing Information

This year almost all of the AP exams are being offered in a digital format. The exceptions are the World Language exams and Music Theory - they are only being offered as pencil-paper exams. The CollegeBoard provided us with three testing window options. The testing window that was selected by the district was selected for two reasons: 1) to allow teachers the most time to teach their college-level curriculum and the students the most time to learn this college-level material considering the different schedules the district has been working under this year and 2) this testing window offered all of the exams we offer as digital exams.

I would like to be able to offer more information about the digital exams at this time, but I cannot as the information coming from the CollegeBoard is changing weekly (the next update is due out April 8th). Students will receive more information from their AP teachers in May.

One question that has come up that I will address here is: "I do not want to take the exam anymorehow do I cancel it? Will I get my exam fee refunded?" The answer is: You cancel your exam by not taking the exam. Once the exams are completed on June 11, I will compare the list of exams ordered (paid for) to the list of exams taken and any student that paid for an exam but did not take the exam will receive a full refund. The refund will be pushed back to families through Campus Portal.


