Grades K-2 Reopening: In-Person Vikings starts on Monday, November 16; Virtual Vikings continue

After a Board Meeting on Thursday, October 29, our K-2 families now have the choice to attend school in person starting November 16. Families may also choose to continue learning virtually.

- Starting November 16, there will be two cohorts (groups) of students -- our In-Person Vikings and our Virtual Vikings.
- In-Person Vikings will attend school Monday through Friday from 7:45 a.m. to 1:45 p.m.
 - In-Person Vikings who receive lunches at home right now will continue to receive lunches at school.
 - In-Person Vikings who do not currently receive lunches at home, but wish to have breakfast and lunch at school starting November 16, must sign up. We will have more information about signing up next week.
- In-Person Vikings will be required to wear masks, and socially distance as much as possible.
- We are offering transportation to eligible riders. There will be assigned seats. If families
 have the means to do so, we highly encourage student drop off to reduce the number of
 kids on our buses.
- Virtual learning will remain an option for families who feel it is best for their student during this time. Our staff to student ratio varies between 1 adult to 8 students and 1 adult to 13 students. Student schedules remain largely the same, as does curriculum and expectations.

• In order to change your decision, you will need to get permission from the District Administrator as it could have staffing implications.

We are asking ALL of our families with students in kindergarten, 1st or 2nd grade to make a selection for November 16. Please fill out our 2-question form <u>HERE</u> by MONDAY, NOVEMBER 2 at 4 p.m. Families who do not fill out our form by this time will be called.

We will provide you with all the details in the next two weeks. Please watch your inbox.

Peachjar for School Flyers Launched on Monday, October 26

In an effort to improve family and community engagement, SASD schools will begin using Peachjar to send digital flyers directly to families. Peachjar is an electronic flyer communication tool and has replaced paper flyer distribution. You will receive school-approved digital flyers delivered to your inbox and by visiting our flyerboard on our school's website.

Last Monday, you should have received a Welcome email from Peachjar with log-in information. You do not need to log into your account at any time to receive flyers. However, if you wish to change your notification preferences, use the link in the Welcome email.

Family information is loaded directly into Peachjar and updated weekly so there is no need to sign up for most families. If you do not receive a Welcome email by Tuesday, or you would like to add additional family members, go to Peachjar.com, click "SIGN UP," and add your name and school.

The month of October is Bullying Awareness and Prevention Month. This month is recognized by many national organizations and is dedicated to bringing awareness to the prevalence of childhood bullying and the consequences it ca



prevalence of childhood bullying and the consequences it can cause. The staff at Fox Prairie Elementary is committed to provide a safe, secure and respectful learning environment for all

and at school-sponsored activities. School wide, students K-5 are taught bully prevention lessons from the evidence based Second Step curriculum. These lessons teach students the skills to recognize bullying, ways to refuse it and how to report it to a trusting adult. Fox Prairie also participates in the Safe School Ambassador program. This is a student-centered bystander education program aimed to reduce bullying/peer mistreatment and enhance school climate. Participating 4th and 5th grade students attend a two day training learning about the types of peer mistreatment and safe ways to intervene. Throughout the school year these students continue to work with our staff leaders of this group to practice skills and get support.

Join our commitment to bringing awareness and education to staff, students, and our community about the impact of bullying and what we can do to stop it. Snap&Read is available to any student with a chromebook in the SASD and gives your child a toolbox of reading tools to use wherever they read (websites, Google Classroom, ebooks.

worksheet, and even tests) into an audio book. *Snap&Read can read text aloud* (like an audiobook), *simplify text, translate into over 100 languages, and provide executive functioning tools, highlighting, and note-taking supports*.

Securly Filtering

The District uses Securly to filter student Chromebooks while students are at school and at home. Securly provides visibility for families to their student's online activity when they are using their district Chromebook at home. Securly also gives families access to a parent portal where you can set additional internet filters while your student is at home

What can I expect to see from Securly?

If you are a family returning to SASD from previous years, you will continue to receive weekly emails from Securly with information on the websites your student has accessed the previous week.

If you are a family new to SASD, you will receive an email from Securly in the next week that will include information on how to access your parent Securly account. After your account is created, you will begin to receive a weekly email with the websites your student has accessed.

How do I sign into the parent portal?

You can access the parent portal in three different ways: the SecurlyHome app (recommended), the weekly activity report email, or the Securly website. <u>Linked here</u> is an article evaluation the different ways you can sign into the parent partal.

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURE

Attendance will be taken daily at the elementary level. Teachers will take attendance during each of the synchronous (live) instructional sessions, and will look for work activity at the end of the school day. If at 4:00 PM a student has not been "present" during the school day, an automated message will be sent to their family.

Have no fear! If your student completes activities between 4:00 PM and the next school day, we can easily change the student's attendance during the following school day.
