Attendance Office Message

Starting 4/19/21, we will be entering Phase 3 for students grade 9-12. Attendance will continue to be taken every day based on what option the student/family has chosen.

If a student has chosen in-person learning they are expected to be in the building attending classes each day.

If a student is unable to attend school they may use a parent excuse or a medical excuse(with documentation) to excuse their absence.

If there is an extenuating circumstance that requires a student who is scheduled for in-person learning to attend virtually this must be approved by administration through communication with the parent/guardian prior to the absence.

*Exceptions to the above are if the student is considered a close contact and is quarantining or has a positive COVID test.

Covid-19 Vaccine Update

As you may know, children as young as 16-years-old are now eligible for the Covid-19 vaccination. Public Health Madison & Dane County (PHMDC) is currently utilizing the <u>Wisconsin COVID-19 Vaccine</u> <u>Registry</u> to help schedule vaccination opportunities for those interested. On April 8th, we were informed that PHMDC is expecting more of the Pfizer vaccination starting next week, which is the vaccine that can be given to 16 and 17-year-olds. If you have an eligible student and are interested in getting them vaccinated, you can register them on the <u>Wisconsin COVID-19 Vaccine Registry</u>

It's Tornado and Severe Weather Awareness Week in Wisconsin

SASD families,

This week is Tornado and Severe Weather Awareness Week in Wisconsin. At SASD, this means reviewing our tornado and severe weather drills with all students and staff, and encouraging families to prepare an at-home emergency plan with their students.

In order to minimize the number of students in a given space, this year we are substituting our normal tornado drill with a review of protocol in class. By the end of this week, students and educators will have reviewed what to do in case of a tornado or severe weather, where to go, and how to get there. We also want to encourage families to put a plan in place for emergency weather situations. Here are some resources to get you started:

- Dane County Emergency Management offers advice in <u>this document</u> for creating a <u>family</u> <u>emergency plan</u>. You can also <u>sign up to receive emergency notifications</u> via text or email to be alerted to potentially life-threatening and public safety emergencies in Dane County.

ASPIRE Testina

9th and 10th-grade students will be taking the Aspire test on **Tuesday, April 27th, 2021**. This test is an early high school version of the ACT. The results give students critical feedback on their academic strengths and areas in need of improvement. It also provides indicators of college readiness, as well as an estimated ACT score.

Please note the following as the test date approaches:

- 11th and 12th-grade students will not have school on Tuesday, April 27th, 2021.
- The test is in person at Stoughton High School. There is not a virtual option.
- Capacity in testing rooms will be below 20 students.
- Students must wear masks and follow social distancing guidelines.
- Any family, virtual or in-person, may opt-out of the test.
- To opt-out, email High School Principal Mike Kruse: <u>mike.kruse@stoughton.k12.wi.us</u>.
- The Aspire test will be a full day of testing, beginning at 9:00 am and ending at 3:15 pm.
- Students will use Chromebooks to test. Please make sure your student comes to school with their Chromebook fully charged.
- Students should bring a pen or pencil with them.
- The Mathematics test allows the use of a calculator. There is a calculator embedded into the test, but students may bring their own calculator. Calculators must meet the following guidelines: <u>ACT</u> <u>calculator policy</u>
- Lunch will be available in the cafeteria. Students may also bring their lunch.

Also, please encourage your student to do their best, and please avoid making appointments on this day. Students perform better after a good night's sleep and a hearty breakfast. Contact Andrew Burke at <u>andrew.burke@stoughton.k12.wi.us</u> if you have any questions.

FORWARD Testing

The Wisconsin Forward Exam will be administered to students who are in grade 10 at the high school level each spring. Students will be completing the portion of the Forward Exam in Social Studies. The Exam is designed to gauge how well students are doing in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards. These standards outline what students should know and be able to do in order to be college and career-ready. The Forward Exam is administered online in the spring of each school year. Students will utilize their Chromebooks to access the state test. Their performance on the assessment will not affect any of their current grades. Please encourage your son or daughter to take the test seriously and do the best they can.

The Exam includes:

• Multiple-choice questions: the student selects the correct answers from answer options;

• Short answer questions: the student provides a brief explanation in response to the question; Students must bring their charged Chromebook to their Ancient World History class in order to complete the online assessment. Accommodations and supports for students with disabilities and/or English language learners are built into the system so that the progress of students can be accurately measured. 10th-grade students will take this test in their Ancient World History classes on **May 4th** and **May 5th**. Students who are Virtual or need to complete make-up time will be invited to do so on **May 11th & May 12th** from 7:45 - 8:30 am in the Large Cafetorium. These students will need to access the school from the back entrance #21. *Virtual students, please make sure that you bring any necessary medications with you (epi-pen, inhaler, etc.) on May 11th/12th.*

A/P Testing Information

This year almost all of the AP exams are being offered in a digital format. The exceptions are the World Language exams and Music Theory - they are only being offered as pencil-paper exams. The CollegeBoard provided us with three testing window options. The testing window that was selected by the district was selected for two reasons: 1) to allow teachers the most time to teach their college-level curriculum and the students the most time to learn this college-level material considering the different schedules the district has been working under this year and 2) this testing window offered all of the exams we offer as digital exams.

I would like to be able to offer more information about the digital exams at this time, but I cannot as the information coming from the CollegeBoard is changing weekly (the next update is due out April 8th). Students will receive more information from their AP teachers in May.

One question that has come up that I will address here is: "I do not want to take the exam anymorehow do I cancel it? Will I get my exam fee refunded?" The answer is: You cancel your exam by not taking the exam. Once the exams are completed on June 11, I will compare the list of exams ordered (paid for) to the list of exams taken and any student that paid for an exam but did not take the exam will receive a full refund. The refund will be pushed back to families through Campus Portal.
