Author Visit!

Lisl Detfersen, a Wisconsin author, is coming to Fox Prairie on December 3rd, 2019. She is a cranberry grower in the central part of Wisconsin in Wood County. She has published 4 books: Time for Cranberries, Right This Very Minute, 1,2,3, Jump!, If You Had a Jetpack. Lisl lives on a family-owned cranberry marsh near Wisconsin Rapids, Wisconsin with her husband and two sons.

Lisl H. Detlefsen is the author of a growing number of picture books. Her first, TIME FOR CRANBERRIES was a Junior Library Guild selection, a 2016 Notable Social Studies Trade Book for Young People (K-2), and the 2017 Wisconsin Ag in the Classroom Book of the Year.



IF YOU HAD A JETPACK was a Spring 2018 Kids' Indie Next pick, an ALA LITA 2019 Excellence in Children's and Young Adult Science Fiction Notable Picture Book and listed on the 2019 Edition of the Bank Street College Best Children's Books of the Year.

She has two new titles out for 2019: RIGHT THIS VERY MINUTE which has been named the 2019 American Farm Bureau Foundation for Agriculture's Book of the Year, and 1, 2, 3, JUMP!, a humorous book about swimming lessons. Fall of 2020 will bring ON THE GO AWESOME, a picture book for the vehicle-obsessed.

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1, 2, 3, Jump! First swimming lessons can be exciting and terrifying, but this joyful and imaginative guide shows young readers how to conquer the pool. From what to wear (a bathing suit, of course!) to what to expect (no, your teacher will not be a mermaid), 1, 2, 3 Jump! covers the what if's and how to's of getting in the pool for the first time. There's a lot to worry about (can I be sucked in the filter?) and even more to be excited about (when can I wear flippers?), and our narrator has thought of everything. By the time she's ready, you will want to jump.

Craft Supplies Needed for the Imaginarium Lab

If you have any extra crafting items, paper, building toys, robots, or other supplies that you don't want or need, please drop them off in the library. Please ask friends, neighbors, and family members over the holidays too. We will be using supplies so there will always be a need.

Winter Weather Recess Guidelines

Please note the following guidelines that we use for students at recess time:

- 60+ Degrees Students do not need to wear a coat to recess.
- 35-59 Degrees Students need to wear a jacket or, at least, long sleeves
- 35 Degrees and below Students need to wear a coat, gloves, hat & their legs must be covered.

If there is snow:

- Students must wear boots, coat, and snowpants to play on the equipment or in the fields.
- Students must stay on the blacktop if they do not have boots coat, and snowpants.

Students who are dressed for the temperature are more prepared with warm clothing and are able to stay dryer as they enjoy playing in our winter weather. Thank you for helping with that!

Please note that the district's practice is to have outdoor recess as long as the wind chill temperature is -5 or warmer. Hopefully we'll be able to keep everyone healthy this winter as the temperatures continue to drop.

Needed Math Materials

We are in need of some items for our new math curriculum. Please keep an eye out for the following items from home if you have them. (Note: <u>We do not need gallon containers at this time</u>.)

- -Paper tubes-gift wrap size
- -Paper tubes-paper towel size
- -Paper tubes-toilet paper size (need a TON)
- -Cans or jars that hold slightly more than 2 cups
- -Cardboard boxes/cartons-larger than 8" x 9" x 12"
- -2 liter transparent containers
- -2 quart containers
- -Pint containers (cottage cheese, etc)
- -8 ounce containers (yogurt, margarine, etc)
- -Ounce containers
- -50 ml containers (travel size shampoo or lotion, etc)
- -Plastic bottles, half liter
- -Plastic bottles, varying capacity
- -Plastic bottles (clear), 1 liter with top
- -Plastic wrap, rolls
- -1/2 cup containers or bowls
- -1 cup containers or bowls
- -2 cup containers or bowls
- -Half gallon milk or juice cartons
- -1 quart milk or juice containers
- -Containers for pouring (pitcher with spout), larger than 1 liter
- -Left over grass seed (need about 3/4 lb)
- -Plastic or paper cups (various sizes)
- -Egg cartons (1 dozen size)

Extra Clothes at School

It's always a good idea to have an extra pair of pants & undies at school for your child. Please put an extra pair of each in your child's backpack. When we've had rain overnight, we remind students to stay on the wood chips and blacktop only, but sometimes it's hard to avoid getting a bit wet.

We're always in need of extra pants, especially for our younger students. If you have any extra pants that your child has outgrown, please send them in, and we'll put them to good use.

Watch D.O.G.S. Sign Up

Who are Watch D.O.G.S?

Watch D.O.G.S. are fathers, mothers, grandfathers, grandmothers, guardians, aunts, uncles, or community members, etc., who volunteer for a half or full school day at an official Watch D.O.G.S. school. During the day, Watch D.O.G.S. may read and work on school activities with students, play at recess, eat lunch with students, watch school entrances and hallways, and any other assigned activities where they actively engage with students. On the day of their participation, Watch D.O.G.S. are given a brief review of their involvement and wear an official Watch D.O.G.S. t-shirt identifying them as a Watch D.O.G.S. in the building.

Program Benefits

- Students gain positive role models.
- Schools gain extra sets of eyes and ears. The presence of volunteer adults provides an
 additional deterrent to bullying, enhances a sense of security in the building, and helps
 create an environment conducive to learning.
- Adults get a glimpse of our students' everyday world and learn about the increasingly complex challenges and decisions today's youth are facing. As a result, they can learn to relate better to their student and connect with them.
