I wanted to share a few highlights of our K-2 reopening plan. On Thursday night the Board of Education held a special meeting to hear the district plan for giving k-2 families *the choice* whether to return to in-person school or stay virtual.

Some updates on a K-2 Reopening:

- 1. In a few days, on Monday, October 5 at the Regular Board Meeting, the Board will hold a vote and may approve our proposed K-2 reopening plan, which consists of two groups of K-2 students: the In-Person Vikings and the Virtual Vikings based on family choice. The plan may or may not be approved on October 5.

Snap&Read is available to any student in the SASD and gives your child a toolbox of reading tools to use wherever they read (websites, Google Classroom, ebooks, worksheet, and even tests) into an audio book. *Snap&Read can read text aloud* (like an audiobook), *simplify text, translate into over 100 languages, and provide executive functioning tools, highlighting, and note-taking supports*.

Our shoe drive starts on November 2 and runs through December 18. More information coming!




THIS WEEK IN 5TH GRADE
