June 9th and 10th Student Locker Pick Up and Chromebook/Materials Drop Off

When: June 9 - 2:00-6:00p.m. June 10 - 8:00-12:00p.m.

Why do you need to come?

- We want to see our students! WE MISS YOU!
- Families will be able to pick up supplies, locker contents, report cards (medication if needed) from school.

What do we need to return?

- Chromebook and hotspot (and their power cords). <u>Place</u> items in a plastic bag.
- School materials including classroom material. <u>All</u> <u>classroom materials need to be bagged with your child's name and</u> <u>teachers name.</u>
- Library books

Procedure:

This will be a drive-through process.

For grades 3-5, please use the bus circle. For K-2, please use the front circle. Both are pickup/drop off points open to all. For your reference, the bus circle will have 3rd -5th grade staff members and the front circle will have Kindergarten-2nd grade teachers.

- Students/Families should place bagged and labeled items to be returned to school in the trunk of their car before leaving home.
- All items being returned should be placed in the trunk or rear of the car for staff to pick up.
- · Students/Families should not get out of cars or open doors



- When picking items up, staff will place student belongings in the car trunk
- Please wear a facemask in your car when talking with staff. Staff will remain 6'-8' away from your vehicle

If you arrive by car: Please pull up with the names and grades of your students on car windows. <u>Do not get out of your vehicle</u>. Staff will bring the materials out to your car.

If you arrive by foot: <u>Please wait in line</u> for staff members to bring your materials and to drop off your chromebook. There will be cones placed 8 feet apart to ensure proper social distancing.

PLEASE READ: If a family has an ill member, please do not attend. Other arrangements can be made if you let your teacher (K-5) or building principal know.

Student Meals - Transition to Lunches for Vikings

The current Door to Door Meal Program is sponsored through the National School Lunch Program. Deliveries made on June 8 and 10 will include breakfast and lunch through Sunday, June 14. All final meal bags will also include a flyer with a list of

community resources. These will also be available on our district website.

- On June 8 we will provide one bag per child which will include lunch for Monday; breakfast and lunch for Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday.
- On June 10 we will provide one bag per child which will include breakfast and lunch for Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.

On Monday, June 15 Lunches for Vikings will begin summer meal distribution. To reduce the number of in-person contact days, they will be moving distribution to three days per week which will include meals for all five days.

Students should take two meal bags on Mondays and Wednesdays and one meal bag on Friday. Please check <u>lunchesforvikings.com</u> or their Facebook page for the most up-to-date

Summer EXCEL Update

As you know, the Summer EXCEL administrative team has decided to cancel the upcoming summer school programming, scheduled to run June 15 - July 10. We sent out a survey last week to gauge family interest in providing remote summer instruction, and we thank you for your responses. The survey indicated that the majority of our families would not be likely to sign up for remote instruction so we will not be providing summer remote instruction. While remote instruction will not occur, SASD places a strong value on school and family connections, and a team has been working to develop summer enrichment resources that families can use to encourage connection and engagement even as we are away from one another. You can access these resources on each school website, as well as the Summer Excel website. The offerings will change each month over the summer and are appropriate for students entering grades K-8. 
