THANK YOU FOR ATTENDING PARENT TEACHER CONFERENCES



STEAM NIGHT INFORMATION

Sandhill is preparing for an exciting evening of family fun and exploration. On <u>Tuesday, April</u> <u>21st from 5:30-7 pm</u>, we will host a Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math (STEAM) night that aims to explore all of the facets of STEAM- Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math. This night will be a great chance for families and students to attend mini demonstrations and presentations from community members in these fields, and also for students to gain hands-on experience.

We are looking for adult volunteers who may be involved in or work in one of these industries to volunteer their time and informally present what they do. Each volunteer will have a table and can bring in small samples or a small visual for students to explore at their station. STEAM Night FAQ

What is STEAM Night?

STEAM night aims to explore all of the facets of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math. Students and their families will attend mini demonstrations and presentations from community members in these fields. The goal of this night is for students to learn about STEAM in our community!

When is it? Where is it?

Tuesday, April 21st from 5:30-7 pm in the Sandhill Cafetorium.

What do I need to do if I volunteer?

Share your STEAM expertise! This may be related to your job or a hobby you have. Each volunteer will have a table to display their material. Be present at your table to facilitate exploration with students. This may look like you demonstrating or providing hands-on experiences for students. There's no right or wrong way to STEAM!

Do I need to bring my own supplies?

Yes and no. We ask that you please bring the necessary materials needed to support your activity. However, if it involves consumables that are needed in order for student participation, please contact a member of the Innovation Committee (see contact information below) and we may be able to purchase consumable supplies.

What will students do at STEAM Night?

STEAM Night will be run in an Open House fashion in the Sandhill Cafeteria. Students and their families will be exploring at their leisure (similar to a science fair). There is no set amount of time that they will spend at each location.

What time do I need to be there if I volunteer?

The event will run between 5:30-7 pm. You are able to arrive at Sandhill to set up your table anytime after 4 pm. We ask that you please be ready for students to visit your table by 5:30 pm.

Are there electrical outlets available?


